MTC Sending Three Students to Washington, D.C.

For more than 60 years, the electric and telephone cooperatives of Illinois have given tomorrow's leaders the opportunity to learn from today's public officials. On March 20, more than 200 students from across rural Illinois represented 25 co-ops during Youth Day, including 10 students from McDonough Power and McDonough Telephone cooperatives.

"Youth Day gives students across the state an up-close look at democracy in action as they meet their elected representatives in Springfield," said Baylee Flowers, legal and government relations coordinator at the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives. In addition to meeting elected officials, the students also learned more about their electric or telephone cooperative's role in their own communities and had the opportunity to tour the Illinois State Capitol and the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

State Representatives Dan Swanson (R-71) and Norine Hammond (R-94) met with the students representing McDonough Power and McDonough Telephone. At the end of Youth Day, the top students applicants were interviewed and selected to participate in Youth Tour, an annual trip to Washington, D.C. This year's trip will be held June 14-21. Celena Mangalaraj, Kaden Little, and Abby Starbuck will represent McDonough Telephone on the week-long trip and meet their elected officials, see historic sites, learn firsthand how cooperatives work and gain valuable leadership skills.

Lifeline/Link-up

McDonough Telephone participates in two programs for low-income customers to help offset the cost of telephone and broadband service. Link-Up Assistance provides a one-time credit towards installation of residential phone or broadband service. Lifeline assistance provides a monthly credit on the subscriber's phone/broadband bill. Eligible customers must reside in a household with either a residential phone line or internet service and receive benefits from one of the following programs:

- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension or Survivors Benefits Program
- Household annual income at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

There are several options to apply for Lifeline. You may apply directly through the Lifeline programs National Verifier online portal (<u>https://www.checklifeline.org/</u><u>lifeline</u>). You may also apply for the program by working with a Lifeline service provider either in-person at a store location or online via the service provider's website, if they support that option. Recipe: No Bake Peanut Butter Oat Cups

Chocolate Topping:

½ cup chocolate chips 2 tbs peanut butter flaky salt Directions:

In a medium bowl, mix together the oats, almond flour, peanut butter, syrup, vanilla and salt. Transfer to a muffin tin lined with liners evenly amongst IO slots. Flatten out as best as possible. Freeze the tray for at least 2 hours.

Chocolate topping: In a small pot over low heat, melt the chocolate chips and peanut butter, stirring constantly until smooth and melted. Remove the tray from the freezer and drop about 1-2 tbs of chocolate on the tops of each and smooth it out flat. Sprinkle with the flaky salt and freeze for another hour.

Store in an airtight container in the freezer.
