ATTENTION MTC EMAIL CUSTOMERS!

The MTC Communications Email platform had an update to deploy a new SPAM solution in October. As of October 26th, email customers stopped receiving the DAILY DIGEST emails. All spam will be handled within the junk mail folder within your email account.

Please see below for instructions:

Mark Email as Spam

Select the message to mark as junk. On the toolbar, select Spam.

You can also right-click the message and select Mark as Spam. The email is moved to vour Junk folder.


Mark Email as Not Spam

Sometimes messages that are not junk are placed in the Junk folder. You can move the messages to the appropriate folder in a number of ways: Drag the message to another folder, Select message and click Not Spam, or Rightclicking the message and selecting Mark as Not Spam.


- Orag the message to another folder.
- 4 Select the message and click **Not Spam** on the tool bar
- 6 Right-click the message and select Mark as Not Spam. The selected message moves to your Inbox.

Learn how to make this delicious copycat Starbucks coffee drink at home! In minutes, you'll be enjoying this DIY pumpkin cold foam on top of your favorite fall coffee beverage.



Recipe Title: Starbucks Pumpkin Cream Cold Brew

Ingredients:
For the Cold Brew
1.5 c. cold brew concentrate
1.5 tsp. granulated sugar
34 tsp. vanilla extract
Ice cubes, if desired

For the Pumpkin Cream

2 tbsp. heavy whipping cream

2 tosp. whole milk

1/2 tsp. pumpkin puree

¼ tsp. granulated sugar % tsp. vanilla extract pinch of ground turmeric (optional) pinch of pumpkin spice Directions:

Cold Brew. Pour the cold brew, sugar, and vanilla into a 13-ounce glass and stir until the sugar has completely dissolved. Add more sugar, if desired.

Pumpkin Cream. Pour all of the foam ingredients into a mixing bowl and froth them with a milk frother or a hand-held electric mixer on high speed. If you're using a mixer, it will take about 2 minutes for the mixture to thicken to a whipped cream-like consistency.

Assembly. Pour the pumpkin cream over the back of a spoon so it floats on top of the coffee. It may take a couple of tries to perfect this technique, so don't be discouraged if it doesn't work perfectly the first time. Gamish the drink with a sprinkle of pumpkin spice and enjoy immediately.
